We desperately need healing for groups, institutions, marriages, the wounds of war, violence, racism, and the endless social problems in which we are drowning today. But we won't know how to heal if we don't learn the skills at ground zero: the individual human heart.

As we begin a new year let us ponder the many ways in which God has been at work in our lives to heal us. And let us contemplate the ways that God still needs to work in our own lives. Jesus doesn't call us to point fingers at anyone else. Instead, Jesus calls us to a new way of life that will bring peace and goodness right here, right now.

MISSION COMMITTEE

The Mission program is partly sustained by gifts from the Myers Sisters' bequest and gifts from members. You can designate gifts to "Local Mission" or "Global Mission." This month, the commission decided not to give to anyone because everyone they usually give to in a year had already received a donation.

The Deacon's Shoe Ministry: The Deacons have delivered 23 pairs of shoes in 2025.

Food Pantry: The food pantry served **46** households and **112** individuals from December 1st through December 23, 2025.

Thus far in 2025, we have served 651 bags (or homes) and 1608 people.


